Newsletter Roof Restoration Project Number 15

Hopefully, this will be the final report regarding the roof restoration project. With just one week to go before the re dedication mass , the vast majority of work has now been

completed. Once the furniture has been put back into the church, the new lighting can be set and the sound system tested. The official hand over of the building is due to take place on Friday 26th May .This marks the end of the contract which has involved many specialist trades and conservation specialists, all of whom have expertise of working on historical churches. Unfortunately, all the work to strengthen the roof and replace the failed trusses and rafters is hidden above the new ceiling. We will try to display photographs of the work to give you some idea of how extensive the restoration has been.

Fr Sony is very grateful to the army of volunteers who are currently giving up their time to clean the church and return the furniture and statues back in place in readiness for the re dedication mass which will be celebrated on Sunday 25th May at 10.30. Bishop Swarbrick will be the main celebrant and will be joined by several priests who have covered in recent years when Fr Sony has been away. Representatives of the Diocese Property Office, Goosnargh Parish Council, The Albert Gubay Foundation, The National Churches Trust, the Knights of St Columba, our Conservation Architect, Dominic Roberts and Luke Watson and his team of builders have all been invited. The school band will be in attendance and, if the weather is fine, will provide music outside the church when refreshments are served after mass.

The mass and rededication will mark a major milestone in the long history of our parish and should be a most joyous occasion. Please spread the word that all will be welcome and, if you know anyone who has mobility issues and struggles to get to church, please inform any member of the PPC so that transport can be arranged.
