Major Roof Repairs - Update Number 10, 19th January 2025

I am pleased to inform you that our roof restoration project is progressing well and slightly ahead of schedule. Next week will be Week Sixteen of the Twenty-Five-week programme. During the course of the week a container housing all the new roof slates will arrive on site. It will be positioned at the end of Bob Barron Way leaving enough room on the car park should a funeral take place during the next few weeks. Site meetings with the contractor and conservation architect are held every month and to date no significant issues have been recorded.

Good progress has been made to raise the roof trusses and following a visit from our structural engineer, additional steel bracing brackets have been attached to the roof structure. This should ensure the roof is completely stable and robust for many years to come. The old asbestos ceiling and the cornice which surrounded it have been removed and matching designs for a modern replacement are being created. Work to fit the new ceiling will begin next week. Once the ceiling and walkways above it are installed, work will begin to rewire the building and fit our new eco-friendly energy saving light fixtures. All this work will

be carried out in parallel with the installation of the new roof slates, a task which is estimated to take five weeks. Once all the structural work has been completed, work will begin to redecorate the interior of the church and to clean and return the sanctuary and nave to their former glory. Although all the interior of the church has been covered with thick plastic sheets, the altar, pews, fixtures, and floor coverings will need to be thoroughly cleaned prior to the reopening of Hill Chapel.

The contractor costs for the work amount to approximately, £264,000. This does not include the pre-contract planning and design costs nor the conservation architect's contract fees. All costs are excluding VAT which must be paid before we can claim it back under the government Historic Places of Worship Scheme, which is due to end on the 31st of March. With this in mind, the contractors have agreed to provide prompt invoices which we can then pay in time to qualify for a VAT reclaim. We still need to continue fund raising in order to ensure that we have adequate funds in our account once all the building costs have been paid.

All being well the church will be ready for rededication, by Bishop Paul, hopefully during the first two weeks of April. The church should then be fully operational again in time for Easter. The final date and plans for the rededication mass and ceremony will be published nearer the time.
