

The Resurrection

Night

Hope is broken. Friends are gone. Sadness fills our hearts. Death is at the door. We don't know where to turn. We have lost our way and cannot trust anyone, even God. We feel like we are surrounded by darkness full of shadows. We do not dare to look for the way out. It is night! *For Jesus' friends, it was night.*

Day

There is a little sliver of light on the horizon. So small! Little more than a glimmer of light. So fragile. But night has broken. Slowly the light grows stronger and advances, chasing the shadows away. Finally the light is all around, it lights up faces and hearts. Day is broken! *For the disciples that morning there was the possibility of hope.*

Risen

God raised Jesus from the tomb. He is risen. All the forces that had gathered against him – hate, exclusion, lies and hate – are defeated. Jesus' love and trust in God conquered them all. Even death lost its power. Jesus crossed the barrier between death and life – opening the way between the two. This opening will never close. The risen Jesus walks ahead of us, removing obstacles that stand in the way. From now on, hope is found in death. When we follow in Jesus' footsteps we go to the other side of death – we go to life eternal.

Easter Sunday

Thanks to Jesus who rose from the dead - Easter is the first day of a new world where life triumphs. Today we celebrate.
