
Sunday 14th December - Christmas Fair in school.(After mass)

IMPORTANT HEALTH & SAFETY NOTICE 16th November 2025

As part of our regular parish maintenance checks, a recent inspection of the gravestones in our churchyard identified several loose and potentially dangerous memorial stones; all need to be made secure. Some of the gravestones are very old but others are relatively recent. Initially, we are obliged to allow time for the families owning the gravestones to make them secure, otherwise, after three months from the date of this notice, some may have to be removed or laid down flat to avoid any future accidents. I list below details of all these graves. If your family has a grave in the churchyard and it appears on the list, please act now to make it secure. If you require any help or advice in doing this, please contact any member of the property group. It would be very helpful if you could let me know once a gravestone has been made safe.

St Francis Hill Chapel Graveyard Wobble Test Conducted September /2025

Looking out from the church door:

Centre Plot immediately outside church.:

Row 7 - Very loose - new style grave: Frank & Elizabeth Holden 1978 & 1983.

Row 7 Stone cross close to a tree, very loose: John & Helen Poulton & Richard Ibison – Old grave date not legible.

Row 8 Very loose Stone Cross: Infants Mary & Hilda very old grave no dates.

Row 10 Loose 5th grave from left path, square stone cross Charles Mahon.

Row 10 New style black stone Christopher Hardacre x 2 1970.

Graves the other side of the Centre Path

Row 12 Two graves in from the cremation gravestone area, newish grave in black: Gerald Gornall 1998 - very loose.

Row 12 Loose grey gravestone next to path Mary Flynn 1998.

Side Graves facing the centre

1st Row Loose dark grey modern stone: Richard & Jane Gornall 1968.

2nd Row First grave nearby the war memorial, grey stone Frances & Richard Gornall – 1981 & 2017 very loose.

2nd Row Stone cross John & Martha Holden 1929, very loose.

2nd Row Very loose DANGEROUS light grey granite cross James Arrowsmith 1932.
