December School News...

What a busy few weeks we have had in school!

The children in Key Stage 1 put on a fabulous nativity production of 'A Big Little Nativity'

Our Nursery and Reception children sang carols around the tree, spreading Christmas cheer in church, topped off with a visit from an elf! They have also been busy learning to sign 'Merry Christmas Everyone' to raise money for 'Speech and Language UK'.

Our Key Stage 2 children reminded us of the true meaning of Christmas in the advent service, singing and reading beautifully.

We had our annual Christmas music concert too, where our band, choir and Glee Club performed a variety of Christmas songs - what an amazing array of talent!

In classes, children have embarked on their advent journey through learning about the nativity story in Nursery and Key Stage 1, Christingle and The Mass in Years 3 and 4, and year 5 and 6 have been learning about the Joyful Mysteries. Travelling Nativity bags have been making their way round families to share at home.

In Key Stage One, the children have been looking in depth at the Nativity story – sequencing the events and looking at the importance of that story in celebrating the importance of Christmas.

Beacon Class have completed an art unit on mixed media self-portraits; Fairsnape have been learning about rocks, fossils and earthquakes.

We are taking a group of children carol singing at Belmont Care Home this afternoon and looking forward to our Christmas Dinner at lunchtime!

The whole school went to see the pantomime - Peter Pan at Lowther Pavillion in Lytham and thoroughly enjoyed the experience.
