## From the Archives

First of all, may I wish you all a Very Happy, Peaceful Christmas and New Year period.

As we come to the end of 2025, I cannot help looking back on what has been a truly historic and eventful year for our diocese and for our own parish here at Hill Chapel. The Lancaster diocese celebrated its centenary with many special events at the cathedral and around the parishes. Here at St Francis', we have had much to celebrate and be thankful for. At Christmas time last year, the church was closed, it was covered inside and outside with scaffolding and all the slates had been stripped off the roof. We celebrated this most holy season with masses at Claughton and in our school here at The Hill. The church remained closed for the next five months whilst the architect, Dominic Roberts and the main contractor, Austin Watson Ltd, totally repaired and restored our church to the beautiful building that we have today. In May we witnessed the rededication of the church by Bishop Swarbrick, a unique, 'once in a lifetime' celebration that the majority of other parishes will never witness. The bishop was here again in July to confirm twenty-five of our young people; in June, nineteen children received their first communion. Since the church reopened many babies and children have been baptised and welcomed as new Catholics into our parish community. Sadly, we have lost several old friends. R.I.P.

Hill Chapel might only be a small rural parish but it has a fantastic Christian, Catholic community; long may it continue! As

we move towards 2026, I share with you a poem of Joy that I recently received from Fr Pat McMahon, perhaps the message it gives could be our parish New Year Resolution. Thank you for reading my articles this year.
