Stay Awake Be ready!

.We may be reaching the end of the calendar year, but Advent marks the very beginning of the Church's year. I personally feel Advent is such a special part of our lives as we enter this season looking ahead. We prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ at Christmas – a time of excitement and joy. We also wait in hope and expectation for the day when he will come again. As today's gospel makes clear, we do not know when that might be, and life will largely carry on as normal. People will go about their daily lives, eating and drinking, working and celebrating, because none of us know when the moment will come.

But as Christians this isn't just a time of passive waiting; we must stay awake and be found ready, whenever the time arrives. We are asked in the first and second readings of today to walk in the light of the Lord. This means changing our behaviour, working for peace, putting aside anger and ill feelings and anything that causes negativity.

It is time for us to focus on being really good neighbours to one another and to build a better world, which reflects the vision of God's

kingdom as we joyfully await its coming. It is not always easy to 'stay awake' to the realities of life as we all know. There are often many hurdles we have to jump over, many challenges to face but always looking for evident signs of hope in our world today.

We are called to be found ready when Christ comes again, what does this mean for how we live our lives? How will you try to be a good neighbour to others this Advent?
