Although our church is now structurally sound and in beautiful condition, there are still one or two projects for the property group to complete. During the next few weeks and in order to comply with health and safety requirements, access to the church loft area will be improved. The balcony will be closed for a short period whilst the work is undertaken. Later in the year, the property group hopes to commission work to renovate the external aspect of the church bell tower. A few minor issues were identified whilst work was being carried out inside the building but, as the work needed wasn't urgent, it was decided to postpone until this coming year. I will keep you informed of developments.

On a separate note, you may recall that towards the end of last year parishioners were invited to recall happy memories of Hill Chapel. During Christmas week I received an email from Fr. Pat McMahon detailing his favourite memory, which I share with you here:
