From the Archives

On Sunday the 1st of February, Fr Sony will be away from the parish and **the 10.30 mass that day will be celebrated by Reverend Anthony Dampson, a member of the Society of African Missions, or SMA as it is known.** The SMA is not a religious institution but a Society of Apostolic Life. Its headquarters are in Rome but the SMA operates in seventeen countries and has members, known as SMA Fathers, from twenty-four different nations.

The SMA was founded in 1856 and is dedicated to spreading the gospel and serving communities in Africa and among people of African descent. The British SMA Province had its beginnings in Manchester in 1953 where today it has a mission promotions centre. A further two mission promotions centres are located in Northwood near Watford and Dunblane in Scotland. The Provincial Superior resides in Manchester. The Society of African Missions is known as the SMA Fathers but people often ask, why SMA and not SAM? The initials refer to the name in Latin, 'Societas Missonum ad Afros', which translates to Society of African Missions.

The Society's mission encompasses various broad headings but its main aim is to proclaim the gospel and provide humanitarian support to the poor and marginalised in underdeveloped and underserved areas of Africa. SMA members engage in the promotion of social development, education, health care and the improvement of general living conditions for the African people. They work to address issues of justice, peace and environmental sustainability in relation to street children, refugees, and war displaced individuals. They strive to

engage in interreligious dialogue, promoting understanding and cooperation among different faiths, including African traditional religions and Islam.

The SMA encourages individuals to support their mission through financial donations, prayer and participation in various events. They also offer opportunities for laypeople to engage in missionary work alongside their priests and brothers.

Next weeks Sunday collection will be specifically for the society of African Missions.. Please give generously to support the valuable work the SMA community undertakes.
